- COS High Impact Project
 - Identify courses that fulfill "high-impact" criteria
 - o If curricular changes are needed, Vicky will work with programs to integrate course changes by 2020 goal
 - o Will email all for preferred contact what's going on right now
 - High Impact Practices (HIP) courses and experiences will be different by major. Hips can change student's life we should ensure they have some of those experiences
 - Pegasus Path mapping out undergraduate degree program, incorporating HIPS. UG Cordinators have been asked to identify high impact experiences. Recommend including coordinator on College Project
- Student Conduct vs Grade Appeal
 - Referenced email sent out (from Jana Jasinski) re students and their conduct
 - College also developing a statement to provide all faculty (see "College Statement"): Please provide feedback to Teresa Dorman by 9-13-17
 - o Student conduct process is not in conflict with assignment of grades: these are mutually exclusive
 - o Recent cases reported via academic student conduct where student may be found in violation or not
 - ✓ Student may feel empowered to go back to faculty to change grade if found <u>not in</u> violation of Student conduct
 - ✓ Change of Grade is not required
 - o Class Syllabus, Program Handbook, Assignment Description Student has to know what your criteria are
 - o Graduate College is working on Inserting a statement (by September) into each Graduate Handbook
 - ✓ Provide feedback to Tracy Jones directly or to Jana Jasinski
 - o Brochure coming from Graduate College
 - Grade Changes/ Grade Appeals discussed

- Graduate Update
 - o (Information from) Graduate Associate Dean's meeting Tuesday
 - Emails sent out regarding students close to 7-year rule next will be 6 year. Please communicate plan
 - Annual review with doctorate students. Template will be available. Will help to see if students are mentored
 - Won't be able to register until they provide plan not automatically
 - o Courses will drop off
 - o Appeals committee being instructed. No more exceptions
 - Updated syllabus policy coming out soon. All courses should have a syllabus, including internships, thesis etc. to have contract with students
 - o COS goals for graduate enrollment. Did not meet our goal 50 shy
 - o GEM worksheets what can you do realistically for your goals. Funding availability in late September
 - Two day visit in October Diverse Academic Opportunity Program potential doctoral students. McNair came and visited previously and this is an expansion. 26 are coming: 6 in sciences. Graduate Studies will be reaching out directly. Set up lab tours October 5. Make sure they get a welcome
 - Post Doc University is at 94 post docs on way to 200: 37 supported off P3 program. 19 faculty applied; 11 awarded; 8 asked for more info
 - o Seminar support is \$5K
 - Sent out information on doctoral research support award to help with research awards not travel to conference. Suggested: Buy samples, training materials etc. Will resend new form. Money will be transferred to units.
 - o New Policy re Title 9. Defines who responsible employees are. Harassment must be reported
 - Either know or should have known
 - o Let's be Clear campaign will see this more in training for faculty
 - o Q&A followed
- Update on Research Facilities
 - Ethics & Compliance Strong policies on federal grants to pay for services supporting research
 - o Facilities have been strongly affected
 - Conditions don't allow some facilities to be run heavily subsidized
 - Possibility for facilities to be centralized
 - Unique opportunity now will not be used by clusters
 - o Dr. Liz Klonoff moving facilities into the new Interdisciplinary Building
 - o Will send email out contemplate a move to that space to centralize
 - ✓ Please list facilities that can be foreseen as being centralized and share current plan
 - ✓ Need to move quickly
 - Shared facilities people asked to share cost
- Strategic and Growth Hiring
 - o Deans voted and strategic hires approved
 - ✓ Have to hire as we proposed; they come with fixed maximum Salary and start-up
 - o Growth Model:
 - ✓ College gets (or loses) fixed \$95/sch undergraduate; \$188 sch graduate
 - ✓ Half goes formulaically to departments that grew
 - ✓ Was funded using restricted World Class Scholar funds– have to use tenured and tenure earning
 - ✓ Therefore we are funding lines rather than funds
 - ✓ Showed growth lines: 4 now and 5 anticipated next year
 - ✓ Will keep track of over- or under-funding of growth
