Chair Report: Robert Littlefield update on school to college transition. Acknowledged disconnection during move and appreciation for dedication from faculty/staff during this time. Want to remain positive. Great opportunity, also hard work to create/build a new culture. Remember to take care of each other along the journey. Help each other, encourage each other, be civil. He's positive and optimistic. Will continue to keep us updated. Met with provost and 2 deans, end of November. Shared perspective. Identified three syllogisms: 1) you cannot have a shared vision when leadership has divided visions, disciplinary integrity and interdisciplinary 2) and resources – COS, COAH – university is allocating funds for 20 new advisors. Distribution of resources. 3) Staff procedural conflict with sustainability, two colleges. Concern that moral will be in jeopardy if we disengage at this juncture. Provost: independent bodies, among others. Plans to hire vice-provost and business manager for downtown. Provost is coming downtown January 22<sup>nd</sup>, to have a conversation with the provost.

Michelle Dusseau spoke to poor SPIs as a result of transition problems, technology (synchronous classroom), transportation, etc.

Littlefield said he would write a rationale for people in such circumstances and give to Deanna to include in performance evaluation.

Jennifer Sandoval said, university needs to recognize that students had a very difficult time with the transition.
